<b>Position description</b>	<p>The position offers mainly outpatient-based medicine in a private practice setting, an experience that may be difficult to gain in a public hospital setting. The AT sees patients off the consultants' lists but could follow the patients for the year and experiences chronic disease management. The AT consults with patients independently and provides an initial management plan, according to their level of confidence and expertise. The consultants then join every consultation and further discuss and refine the treatment decisions.</p> <p>In addition there is close collaboration with the clinical trials unit at Macquarie University for a range of innovative trial work both with industry and the university.</p> <p>The trainee has found this a valuable learning experience, allowing a mix of autonomous decision-making, and supervision. The breadth of experience would be beneficial for an AT at any stage. MUH does not have an emergency department, therefore exposure to acute endocrine emergencies is limited. Inpatient acute endocrine emergencies such as severe hypercalcaemia, pituitary apoplexy are managed in the intensive care unit with the support of the specialty teams. The trainee provides inpatient consultations to the hospitals' medical and surgical units, being the first on-call during hours. No after-hours on-</p>

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	<p>call duty. The AT collaborates closely with the diabetes nurse educator, Ms Niki Witney who is has a specialised Type 1 focus in insulin pump and technology.</p> <p>The trainee is responsible for organising the monthly pituitary and general endocrinology, thyroid and adrenal multidisciplinary meeting and performs basic dynamic endocrine tests. The unit has a strong focus in research and development; the AT has an afternoon per week dedicated to research and participation in clinical trials, a highly valuable experience and exposure to research. There is an office space for the trainee with access to core Diabetes and Endocrine texts and journals online, and a well-equipped library on university campus. The trainee reported being highly satisfied with the quality of training and level of supervision and support within the unit. The workload for the trainee is appropriately balanced for training with assigned time for research, reading and meeting attendance. Educational activities Educational activities include a fortnightly journal club and regular clinical case discussions about complex patients and referrals. There is a monthly pituitary multidisciplinary meeting and a general endocrinology - thyroid/adrenal/parathyroid/neuroendocrine MDT. Additionally, there is dedicated time allocated for research trials involvement on Thursdays afternoon. The AT is appointed as a conjoint lecturer at the Macquarie University Medical School, actively participates in bedside teaching of medical students and academic activities of the MD program. The AT is encouraged and given opportunities to attend the monthly Sydney inter-hospital Endocrinology clinical meeting, Hormone school, national society meetings and related workshops.</p>
